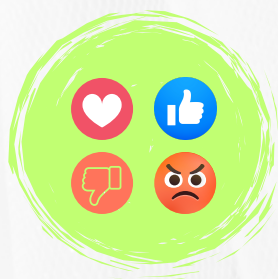

I like **coffee**

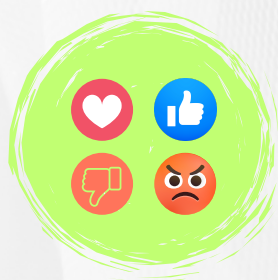


She doesn't like **meat**

I like **reading** novels



She doesn't like **swimming**



They hate **cooking**



You can use LIKE + to...

It means you think it is OK or necessary to do something, although you might not enjoy it.

A veces, el verbo LIKE puede ir seguido de un INFINITIVO (TO...) pero en este caso no queremos decir que disfrutamos haciendo algo sino que nos parece correcto o necesario hacer algo aunque no nos guste.
